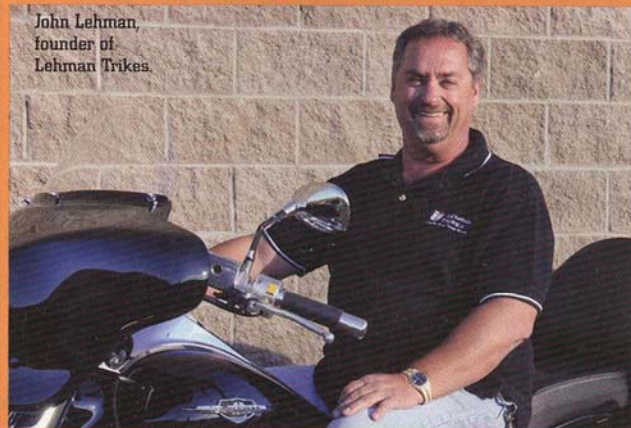

The Sturgis Motorcycle Museum and Hall of Fame honors men and women who have dedicated much of their lives to improving, promoting and advancing the sport and lifestyle of motorcycling. “There couldn’t be a more humble man to receive this award,” says Ken Hines, Executive Vice President of Lehman Trikes, “we are extremely proud of John and his accomplishments. He’s a kind-hearted guy and is respected throughout the motorcycle industry.”

John Lehman developed the first modern trike in 1984 for his wife, Linda, who was reluctant to ride on two wheels with one of their children on the back. It wasn’t long before the orders came pouring in and John’s idea became a business. Today, Lehman Trikes is publicly-traded and, Hines says, has created a new industry of three-wheeled motorcycles in North America.
